Organized by the National University Centre for Organ Transplantation (NUCOT) at the National University Health System (NUHS), the inaugural 'The Transplant Colloquium 2019' (TTC2019) will be held in Singapore from 22 to 24 November 2019.

Themed **New Horizons in Transplantation**, the TTC 2019 comprises several niche educational activities over an intensive two-and-a-half-day programme. The programme on 22 November will include the Transplant Immunology Masterclass and three workshops in Liver Transplantation (see back for details). The main programme, on 23 to 24 November, will comprise plenary topics, symposia, clinic-pathological conference and kidney and liver-transplant tracks. Participants will be updated on the latest advances in kidney and liver transplantation, in particular, immune aspects, rejection diagnosis and treatment, infection and malignancy.

The Immunology Masterclass

The success of kidney transplant is dependent on appropriate Immune evaluation to minimize rejection and graft failure post-transplant. This Masterclass will provide in-depth education on evaluating pre-sensitization, crossmatches and assessment of anti-HLA antibodies in kidney transplant. The format will include didactic lectures and interactive case discussions facilitated by an expert faculty.

Liver Transplant Surgical Workshop

This hands-on half-day surgical workshop provides participants with practice on live animal designed to provide surgical trainees and fellows with the concepts of surgical techniques in liver transplantation.

Simulation in Anaesthesia/ Critical Care for Liver Transplantation (SALT) Workshop

This is an interactive half-day simulation-based course designed to cover pertinent essentials of liver transplant anaesthesia and critical care.

Transplant Hepatology Workshop

This workshop is an excellent opportunity for medical professionals and trainees in hepatology to discuss management principles of complex cases via informative lectures and case discussions to review the latest evidence.

Transplant Hepatology Preceptorship Programme /

The annual Transplant Hepatology Preceptorship Programme is in its 4th edition since its inauguration in 2016. It aims to support scientific continual education in developing countries. Eligible trainees and fellows will be awarded a travel grant to attend The Transplant Colloquium in Singapore.
